SUPPORT FOR NEW BUILDING GROWS!

Our fundraising work towards our new building continues and we have had some amazing donations to help us reach our goal. We now have the backing of the Gazette & Herald and Pickering CIC who are supporting this project.

Our Gala Dinner (pictured above) in December at the Talbot raised an incredible £13,065. The amount - including Gift aid - was raised via contributions from tickets sales, raffle, a game of 'heads and tails' and an online auction, as well as an extremely generous donation by one of the guests.

What a busy winter RSF has had and now we are preparing for a very busy Spring and Summer.

There has been lots of work going into raising funds for our new building and it is very heart-warming to see so many people get on board with this project.

We are making some great connections with local companies including **Yorkshire Rapeseed Oil**. They chose to support RSF for the year. Aswell as fundraising activities like a sponsored walk along the <u>Wold Rangers Way</u> they created a <u>special oil</u> which RSF gets a percentage of the sale. They also invited RSF groups to come and visit and we had a fantastic day there in October.

RSF also benefitted from the **Coop Community Fund** in 2022 - it is an amazing scheme that supports lots of local groups. When shoppers buy Coop products they donate 2% from their points and Coop match this. The latest round from the Coop, Eastgate, Pickering supported RSF, Camphill Village Trust and Stape Silver Band, who I met with to collect our cheques. RSF received an amazing £5,176 which will fund our Junior Club for disabled children aged 8 to 12.

RSF has started a new group to support LGBTQ+ young people with disabilities and additional needs.



The group is led by Becky, 'Our LGBTQ group is very relaxed, fun and open. We sit and chat about who we are, why we are where we are (If you want to). Our aim at the moment is to get a good group going and a safe place for young people in Ryedale who need us. We would also like to try and plan an outing to the accessible pride in York this year.'
